More than half (54%) of blender owners have poured their mixes into another container that then goes into the refrigerator. More than a third (36%) have placed the whole blender jar in the fridge.

With the Hamilton Beach® thermal blender, consumers can now simply blend and go – their smoothie, shake or ice-drink stays cold for eight hours. When it's tailgate time the drinks will still be frosty, not a watered down mess.

The rugged 48-ounce thermal jar has a convenient handle for carrying that folds out of the way for adding ingredients or pouring. The screw-top lid has a fold-away, pour-through spout and is spillproof with a no-leak design.

All this and the Hamilton Beach® thermal blender is as powerful as it is convenient. It has a 500-watt peak-power motor with 10 speeds.

Cleanup is a breeze. The blades, thermal jar and screw-top lid are all dishwasher safe.
